

## Catalina Foothills High School Named Among Top U.S. High Schools by Newsweek

TUCSON, AZ—In a new study by Newsweek, Catalina Foothills High School was named in the top 500 U.S. high schools. Catalina Foothills High School was one of only two Tucson-area high schools and one of only six Arizona schools named in the list.

In the overall rankings, three measures were used to identify schools that excel at preparing students for college: graduation rate, college bound rate, and college readiness. Catalina Foothills High School has a 98 percent graduation rate and a 92 percent college bound rate. It has a college readiness score of 76.9.

Catalina Foothills High School appeared in Newsweek's Top High School rankings in 2014 and 2013 as well.
