## A Summary Report of the May 13, 2025, CFSD Governing Board Meeting





#### CFSD Star Awards - Seal of Biliteracy

The Catalina Foothills School District Governing Board proudly recognized 62 seniors in the Class of 2025 for earning the Arizona State Seal of Biliteracy—the district's largest group to date. The distinction honors students who demonstrate proficiency in English and at least one additional language. Students earned seals in languages including Chinese (Simplified and Traditional), French, Italian, Japanese, Polish, Portuguese, and Spanish. Six students achieved the Seal in two languages. Both silver and gold distinctions were awarded based on proficiency levels. The Seal will be affixed to their diploma and noted on their official transcript.

Board member Jacquelyn Davoli shared that many recipients began their language studies in CFSD's immersion programs, while others advanced through the district's strong World Languages curriculum. Their achievement reflects CFSD's vision of preparing globally aware, multilingual citizens. The governing board also recognized and thanked CFSD World Languages teachers and staff for their dedication in guiding students to biliteracy. Their work has been instrumental in this achievement.

## <u>Public Hearing on Revisions to Fiscal Year 2025 Budget</u> (Revision #3)

President Amy Krauss opened the public hearing. No comments were expressed, and the public hearing was closed.

# <u>Approval of Revisions to the Fiscal Year 2025 Budget</u> (Revision #3)

Director of Finance Lisa Taetle presented updates to the fiscal year 2025 budget to reflect actual enrollment, expenditures, and strategic adjustments. Key changes include a slight decrease in revenue due to ADM, reclassified capital expenses, additional funding for security software, and new allocations for facility projects. Total bond funds from the April 2025 sale were added at \$12.94 million. The governing board approved the final expenditure budget revision for fiscal year 2025, as presented.

### Approval of the Longevity Addenda for the Second Round of Certified Contracts for School Year 2025-2026

Associate Superintendent Mindy Westover presented a list of staff included in the second round of certified contracts

who qualify for the longevity addenda in the amount of \$1,000. Staff members were previously issued a contract on April 22. The governing board approved the longevity addenda in the amount of \$1,000 for the list of staff included in the second round of certified contracts for school year 2025-2026, as presented, and directed that they be issued to the staff members listed, as presented.

#### <u>Consideration of Revisions to CFSD Performance</u> <u>Award Plan (first reading)</u>

Associate Superintendent Westover presented one recommended change to the performance award plan for the 2025-2026 school year involving the Professional participation requirement, specifically Learning Collaborative Inquiry Teams (CIT). Staff must attend at least twelve (12) CIT meetings to be eligible for the performance award. The change reinstates a previous standard to ensure consistent participation and to strengthen district-wide improvement efforts. With CITs now fully established within the professional learning system, it is appropriate to reintroduce a defined participation threshold. The board asked about how many meetings were held at each school. They requested that the total number of meetings be reflected in the plan. The CFSD Performance Award Plan will be presented to the board for a second reading at its regular meeting on May 27.

#### <u>Fiscal Year 2026 Maintenance and Operations (M&O)</u> Budget Discussion

Superintendent Bartlett shared updates to the fiscal year 2026 budget, including changes to the revenue and expenditure budgets, the Classroom Site Fund (CSF), and the Instructional Improvement Fund (IIF). The revenue budget was adjusted to reduce the transfer from District Additional Assistance (DAA) to M&O, and carryforward amounts were revised due to changes in CSF and IIF expenses. Within the expenditure budget, a reduction to outsourced substitute services and prepaid legal services was reflected, and an increase for district-wide insurance coverage rates, insurance deductibles, athletic coaching stipends, and non-athletic teacher stipends was included. The CSF reflected an increase for performance pay and employee benefits from FY25, while the IIF showed a reduction due to the move of FY25 salary costs to the Title I grant. For FY26, salary expenditures and fixed costs estimates in the IIF were increased as the district has not received its total FY26 Title I grant allocation. The updated M&O budget is available for viewing on the CFSD website as part of the May 13, governing board agenda item 7.1.

#### 2025 Arizona Legislative / Governmental Activity

Board members discussed the state legislature's recess due to disagreements over Proposition 123 and school vouchers, noting the passing of bills including laws on wireless communication and mandatory reporting.

#### Executive Session

The governing board held an executive session for personnel, pursuant to Arizona Revised Statute (A.R.S.) §38-431.03 (A)(1) — Discussion or consideration of employment, assignment, appointment, promotion, demotion, dismissal, salaries, disciplining or resignation of a public officer, appointee or employee of any public body — Annual Performance Review of the Superintendent.
