State Championships

Basketball -

The CFHS boys basketball team captured the state title in their first season in the 5A division, defeating Peoria Centennial 59-45. The Falcons finished the 2020-2021 season with a 19-1 record, with their only loss coming to this year's 4A champion, St. Mary's.
