Graphic Design

Move Mining

CFHS freshman Ingrid Benito and sophomore Cole Warnock won the Move Mining competition at the MINEXCHANGE 2022 Annual Conference and Expo in Salt Lake City, Utah. Their team Terramovers was awarded 1st place for their concept of an interactive video game where players can learn about mining operations, processing, and reclamation. Ingrid and Cole were the only teen presenters among the 5 team finalists.
