I am pleased to highlight the following CFSD student and staff achievements:

#### All A Schools

All of CFSD's K-12 schools (elementary, middle, and high) were graded A by the Arizona Department of Education. The state's A-F letter grade system is an accountability model for school performance. Parameters are year-to-year student academic growth and proficiency in English language arts, mathematics, and science; the proficiency and academic growth of English language learners; indicators that elementary K-8 students are ready for high school and that high school students are ready for success in a career or in higher education; and high school graduation rates. Congratulations to all of our capable students and staff for once again achieving the top grade!

# High School Music - Choir, Orchestra, Band

Congratulations to our Concert Chorale, Concert Silver and Change of Pace for earning the highest possible rating, Superior with Distinction, at the regional Fall Choral Festival hosted by CFHS. Twenty-three other choirs attended. The choirs presented short musical programs adjudicated by local choral experts on performance ability, as well as ability to sight read music that had never been seen before. Concert Silver received the highest performance score and Change of Pace received the highest sight reading scores of any choir in the festival. Their teacher/director is Jeffrey Evans.

Kudos to our Sinfonia and Symphonic Strings orchestras on their performances on Friday, October 20, at the Arizona Band and Orchestra Directors Association Fall Orchestra Festival held at Tucson High School. Sinfonia earned an Excellent with Recognition and Symphonic Strings earned a Superior with Distinction. Their teacher/director is Ryan Watson.

The Marching Falcons represented CFHS on Saturday, October 7, at the Bands of America Festival in Flagstaff, AZ. The Marching Falcons took to the field for the first time ever in this prestigious marching competition, which features bands from around the country. This year's festival had bands from Arizona, California, New Mexico, Colorado, and Nevada. The Falcons found out at the 4:00 p.m. awards assembly that they had made the finals and would march again at 8:00 p.m. The Marching Falcons returned home having earned 8th place overall and 2nd place amongst the bands from Arizona. Director of Bands is Renee Shane-Boyd.

## Cheer

On November 6 at the Arizona Crown championships in Phoenix, the CFHS Varsity and JV Cheer teams both won first place. Varsity also won Showstopper (a judges' choice award), which came with a paid bid award to the World Class Cheer Championship in April.
