STANDARDS FOR VISUAL ARTS GRADE 5

The fifth grade visual arts program provides students with a continuing foundation in art education. Students are engaged in the creative process, problem solving, and aesthetic understanding through the development and examination of their artworks and the work of others. Experiencing the role of the artist, each student applies a variety of media, techniques, and processes to express ideas and develop creativity, critical thinking, and problem solving skills. Students recognize the impact of art on history and different cultures and how history and culture have influenced art. Students inform their production of art by integrating information and skills from other areas of knowledge and academic disciplines. Art experiences are focused around art principles of design as well as the elements of art, which provide a foundation for art vocabulary development and other art concepts.

CREATING (Investigate – Plan – Make) Conceiving and developing new artistic ideas and work
