I am pleased to highlight the following CFSD student and staff achievements:

Tennis State Champions

CFHS swept both the AIA Division II high school boys and girls tennis state championships on May 8. The girls team won the 16th championship in the school's history, and the boys team won their 15th state title. Members of the girls team are Morgan Filer, Emily Flowers, Macy Goode, Serena Hsu, Abbigail Mulick, Annabelle Mulick, Eleanor Nentl, and Sophia Silverman. Their coach is Dan Root. Members of the boys team are Jeevaj Bondalapati, Jack Clements, Krishna Dasika, Hugh Ganem, Santiago Lietzau, Jared Perry, Alexey Pivniouk, Luke Sadalla, and Suraj Shah. Their coach is Jeff Bloomberg.

The 2021 Division II girls state champion is junior Emily Flowers. The 2021 DIvision II boys state champion is sophomore Jared Perry. Abbigail Mulick and Annabelle Mulick are the Girls Tennis Doubles State Runner-Up.

Tennis Singles State Champions

On May 3, our high school tennis players captured the state singles titles at the Paseo Racquet Center in Glendale. The 2021 AIA Division II boys tennis state champion is sophomore Jared Perry, and the 2021 AIA Division II girls state champion is junior Emily Flowers. For Emily, this is her second state singles championship. She won the 2019 singles state title as a freshman. Note: Both the boys and girls tennis teams are advancing to the state semifinals, with the team championships to be decided by Saturday, May 8.

Flinn Scholar

CFHS's Josh Tint is among 20 Arizona seniors selected for the Flinn Scholars Class of 2021. The Flinn Scholarship, valued at more than \$120,000, covers tuition, fees, housing, and meals at one of Arizona's public universities, plus study abroad. In the fall, Josh will major in Computer Science at Arizona State University.

CFSD has produced 16 Flinn Scholars in its history, including 3 in the last 3 years, which is remarkable given that only 2% of applicants statewide are chosen. All Flinn Scholars select one teacher who had the greatest influence on their education, and Josh chose CFHS English teacher Tiffany Fritz. Josh and Ms. Fritz will be recognized at a Flinn Foundation event in May.

National Merit Corporate Sponsorship Scholarships

CFHS seniors Aidan Gee, Robert Pawloski, and Margot Nicholson earned National Merit Corporate Sponsorship Scholarships. The final winners are candidates "judged to have the strongest combination of academic skills and achievements, extracurricular accomplishments, and potential for success in rigorous college studies." Note: Of the 1.5 million juniors who entered the 2021 National Merit Scholarship Program, only 1,000 distinguished high school seniors win corporate-sponsored National Merit Scholarship awards.

Teacher Excellence Award

Tucson Values Teachers (TVT) honored Manzanita kindergarten teacher Kylie Baker with its Teacher Excellence Award. The TVT surprised Kylie on May 4 with this recognition in front of her class. Her student Elizabeth Sipe created a video nomination that she submitted to TVT. Kylie received \$250 cash, a \$100 gift card for school supplies, a plaque, and flowers.
